Housing:

Thammasat Business School, Thammasat University, Tha Prachan Campus does not provide on-campus housing, nor a dormitory. The exchange students have to consult with the Exchange Guidebook containing more accommodation information (i.e., rents, locations, facilities, contact numbers, addresses and e-mail addresses).

Approximate Living Costs (US dollar):

Off-campus room & board:	\$250 to \$900/month (varied by size and location)
Food and meals:	\$150.00 to \$350.00/month
Books and reading materials:	\$150.00 to \$300.00/semester
Local transportation:	Varied yet relatively cheap (bus, ferry, express boat, taxi, etc.)
Personal expenses:	Varied (approx. \$250-\$550/month)

Health Service:

Thammasat Business School, Thammasat University provides Accident Insurance and on-campus medical clinic for all exchange students. However, we strongly encourage you to have your own International Health Insurance from the home country.

Learning Expectations:

- **Class format:** Lectures, case analyses/presentations, papers and projects
- **Attendance:** Class attendance is MANDATORY, **no less than 70% per class**
- **Make-up exam:** Only in a case of medical or family emergency
- **Participation:** Class participation is part of a student's final grade in most courses

- **Class size:** 20 - 60 students per class

- **Course choices:** Exchange students are allowed to take any undergraduate courses across Faculty of Economics and Faculty of Liberty Arts, provided that they meet the pre-requisites, and seats are available.

Course Information:
